Covington Officials Endorse Covington Ladies Home Expansion Project

The Covington City Commissioners passed a resolution endorsing the renovation and expansion of the Covington Ladies Home at their September 20 meeting. Commissioners voiced full support of the project in recognition of the organization's long contribution to the city.

"It was an honor for the Board of City Commissioners to be asked to formally approve a Resolution supporting and endorsing the Covington Ladies Home's expansion project," said Mayor Sherry Carran. "The City is grateful for the integral role the Ladies Home has played in our Covington Community, physically and socially. We wish the Ladies Home all the best in their initiative to enhance quality of life for the ladies under their care."

The City of Covington joins other Civic Sponsors who have endorsed the CLH Expansion, for the betterment of Covington --Baker Hunt Art & Cultural Center; Catalytic Development Funding Corp of NKY; Northern Kentucky Chamber of Commerce; Legal Aid of the Blue Grass; Skyward; Southbank Partners, Inc.; St. Charles Community -- with more to come.

The Ladies Home's "130 Years and Counting" Capital Campaign launched on August 4th, initiating a three-year campaign to raise \$3.5 million for a new one-floor building attached to the current three-story Victorian, which is named to the National Register of Historic Places by the U.S. Department of Interior. The Home was built with excellence in 1894 and has been lovingly modified through the years. This same spirit of excellence compels CLH to move forward with a New Building plan that will provide improved care to the elderly in this 21st century and beyond.

Since 1886, the Ladies Home has provided for the needs of older women in the NKY/Greater Cincinnati area and beyond. During 2016, CLH celebrates 130 Years of Compassionate Care!--a milestone of longevity and service.
